



The following are Rules of Conduct, which Morada Little League requires Parents and Spectators to comply with during regularly scheduled games and all Little League scheduled events.

1. Through well planned and organized efforts, parents are made aware of the Rules, Regulations and Philosophy for Little League Baseball.
2. Are positive in any criticism of the program and willing to volunteer their services to improve it. Present their opinions and criticisms to officers of the league in a private and constructive manner.
3. Clearly understand and try out system and the method of player selection.
4. Demonstrate that they recognize the effort and expended by the volunteer personnel by refraining from profanity, un-sportsman like conduct and “grandstand” managing.
5. Realize that the umpire is closest to the play and the umpire calls them as he or she sees them. The umpire is a *volunteer* who has assumed a difficult but essential role.
 - a. No parent or spectator may make any exhibition or demonstration about a judgment call by an umpire, including balls, strikeouts, fair or foul balls.
6. Recognize that Little Leaguers are *children*, NOT professional players, and need encouragement and NEVER *criticism*.
7. Applaud good plays: ignore errors. Encourage a greater effort, initiative and hustle. Congratulate the winner: encourage the loser. Enjoy the game for what it is. **If it isn't fun, then it isn't Little League.**
8. Most of all try always to remember that this is for the children. Let's do our best together in making this memorable time one of their best.
